(Note-the census of 1851 gives grandma's age as 24)

Married by C. Redknapp. March 11. 1855 (This was a Sunday).

Now this couple had issue a son James Joseph NEWNHAM born 30 Castle Rd (formerly 8 Park Lane) in 1856.

and a daughter Fanny Maria born Hyde Park Rd Southsea 1858.

The son James Joseph married Alice Parnell (compilers' dear mother) Oct. 10. 1878 at Kingston Ch. Portsm.

and had issue four children-Florence Ethel.

Albert James Joseph.

Henrietta Georgina.

James.

the latter by the way was posthumous.

Of these Albert James Joseph married Florence Mabel Shergold at St Saviours, Southwark. Dec. 16. 1899 and had issue

Cecil Albert.

Florence Mabel. Alice.

Leonard Eugene.

all three of these have produced progeny to the extent of seven children, thus we are into the ~~SEVENTH~~ EIGHTH generation.

Barnabas, son of Robert & Hester was my great great uncle (so John brother of Barnabas was my ~~great~~ great grandfather) and naturally was uncle to my grandfather. Now in 1855 Joseph my grandfather came over from Ryde and entered Portsmouth Dockyard on Jan. 25. 1855 as a carpenter and joiner, in March same year he married. He remained on at the house of his uncle Barnabas at 8 Park Lane (now 30 Castle Rd) S'sea, until his son James Joseph was born (my father). Shortly after his birth, it seems that uncle Barnabas could not stand the noise of a child (so my grandma informed me) so my grandparents with my dad moved to Croydon Terrace. Hyde Park Rd, S'sea, where a second arrival was hailed, Fanny Maria by name. This was the complete household, just a pigeon pair so to speak. About the year 1860. The Avenue, King St
