Now Robert and Mester Newnham as I have now proved had three sons of their marriage in 1788(30 Oct.) Robert born Ryde 1790. Barnabas born Rydel793. John born Nov. 25.1796 at Ryde. THIS John was our forbear.

Robert Newnham resided 20 Diamond St S'sea his early years I believe were at Wootton or Whippingham, anyway in the year 1841 at 20 Diamond St, there were;-NEWNHAM Robert approx) Mariner born Ryde age 50 "")his wife. NOT born in Hamps. Johanne 40

17 George son Born HantsWhippingham. (This led served on Victory & Venerable, see my records.) Born Hamps

age 13 Martha daughter Robert 11 son Charles 5 son

This Robert and his family seem to have left Portsmouth because he is not mentioned in the 1851 census, viz 10 years later.

NEWNHAM Bernabas, born Ryde 1793, married 1817 at Whippingham and had their first six children born there, the next seven

making 13 in all were born apparently at 20 Little S'sea St. Upon retiring he went to 8 Park Lane (Now Castle Rd, No 30) He was at 20 Little S'sea St as early as 1837, and in 1855 we see by the directory that he was then at 8 Park Lane. His wife Harriett died Oct. 26.1871 aged 78(77), and he followed very quickly less then a month after-Nov. 20th. 1871 having pined for his wife. His elder sons' demise too just previous to both made the thing a whole calamity.

His eldest daughter Caroline merried one Bond of the Dolphon Hotel in High St. Portsm, and thro' him my grand-dad obtained furtherance in advancement with his job in the Dockyard.

Barnabas was a Service Revenue Cutter and in the sixties was a Custom House pensioner

In 1841 his family at 20 Little S'sea Street was thus;-NEWNHAM Barnabas Harriett born Ryde 1793 age 48 Mariner

Wife Binstead 1795.D 1871 Deu' ** 18 Wootton 1823 Harriett Portsm. 1830 Eliza 10 Son John 1833.D 1879 8 1835.D.1857 Joseph 6 Robert 1837.D.1903. 3 6 mo. " James 1840.D.1899

These are from Census of 1841. The others were not living at home.

JOHN (our forbear DIED in 1833, so no note made either Census obviously, since he died long before 1841)

These them newnhams are the only ones mentioned who are actually of our ilk, in the 1841 Census.

The others however seem to be closely connected and I give these as follow.
